Pastor's Column

Everywhere we turn lately, someone is urging us to "make a plan to vote." Never before have we faced such overwhelming uncertainty at election time that we consistently are reminding one another to plan ahead for getting to the polls and making our voice heard.



Each year around this time in the church, we are asked to make a financial pledge to the ministry of this congregation. As I have been reflecting on our annual stewardship campaign and my own practice of giving, I have found myself repeating, "make a plan to give."

Let me explain. As a newly confirmed teenager with no regular income of my own, I rationalized for many years that my giving to the church would be through service and leadership. After college, I continued with this practice until one year, during the annual pledge drive, I thought, "That's not really what the vow means, Susan. You're

an adult now and you have more to give." My income and expenses were still variable from month to month, and I wasn't sure I had much money to offer consistently, so I decided to start small and focus on the consistency part of my giving. That year, I made a monthly pledge to my church. I wrote it down and turned it in and felt good about taking a step forward in faith.

A few years passed and each year I would wonder if I could increase my pledge. I would consider the financial implications... could I afford to give more each month? How much more? The "step up your giving" charts suggested 1 or 3 or 5% increase, but at the rate I was giving, that didn't even seem significant. Instead, I kept my pledge the same for many years, not sure if I could step it up or if it would really matter.



At some point, I thought about tithing (I think it came up in a Bible study discussion) and the idea of giving 10% of my income seemed amazingly out of reach. How could I give 10% right off the top? My finances were still too uncertain... but then I thought, I don't have to do it all at once. I could increase my pledge by 10% each year and someday I might get close to tithing 10%. That year, when the pledge card came around, I increased my pledge by 10% and I made my plan to grow as a giver – I would increase by 10% each year.

Filling out those pledge cards was much easier once I had a plan. And while the increased amount wasn't too significant at first, over time the effects compounded just like they teach us about saving money for college or retirement. Compounding interest really adds up. It added up my giving too.

A good number of years have passed since I made my plans first to give and then to grow as a giver. Early on, writing my check each month to the church felt good and right, even when money was tight. I have always felt joyful in my giving, and a deep sense of gratitude has grown alongside our giving. Stephen and I feel so grateful for all that we have and can give, and in recent years, we have also made plans to give intentionally to other community organizations too. We may

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not be quite at a 10% tithe yet, but we are closer each year and the sense of blessing and peace we have is much greater than 10% of anything.

As we enter into this stewardship season, I hope you will "make a plan to give" and make a pledge to the church this year. If you already make a regular offering, I invite you to consider making a plan to grow in your giving. It doesn't have to be 10% each year, but make a plan that feels right to you, and give thanks for all you have and all that you have to give. The ministry of this congregation is funded by your generosity, and we have ministry to do here in Willow Glen as God's family growing through caring, sharing and serving. May we grow into it together.
